ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Govt. Degree College Haripurdhar came into existence in the year 2011 and since then has made a steady progress towards ensuring quality education to its students. Situated at the top of a hill, it provides a bird's eye view of the surrounding area. It is located in the serene and picturesque beauty of Churdhar range in the ambience of chaste mountains covered with evergreen cedar trees on one side and the thick woods of beautiful red rhododendron on the other. At the time of its inception, the college ran in 'Maa Bhangayani' Temple Complex and later started operations from the new campus w.e.f. June 2017. Twelve batches of undergraduate classes have graduated from this institute till date. The college presently has ample infrastructural facilities including three smart classrooms, a large and spacious library, examination hall, computer lab, a girls' common room and various office rooms with abundant quality furniture. In addition to these existing facilities, construction of a Multi-Purpose Hall has been undertaken by the funds received as RUSA grant for infrastructural development through HPPWD.

The Multi-Purpose Hall would encompass facilities like Canteen, Gymnasium, etc. in order to provide better amenities to students. To keep pace with the latest technology, facilities like free Wi-Fi, upgraded IT Laboratory with a dedicated server and CCTV cameras for security have been installed in the campus. Sufficient quantity of other material and equipment pertaining to sports and music along with other office and campus equipment like Water filter & storage tank, chairs, garden benches, solar lights, electronic siren, fire extinguishers, wooden flooring, wall paneling, creation of aluminum glass cabins for teachers & purchase of additional books for the library as per the institutional development plan of the college have been accomplished through the funds received as RUSA grant. The college campus has been bejeweled with state of art facilities at par with the colleges in nearby towns and cities, a clear manifestation of the aims of RUSA in providing quality education to "one and all" irrespective of the geographical or social limitations and disparities.

The college offers UG programmes in following subjects of Arts stream: English, Sociology, History, Political Science, Hindi, Physical Education, Music (Vocal), the subjects: Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics in the Science (Non-Medical) stream and Subjects of Commerce stream. The dedicated and highly motivated faculty of the college earnestly endeavors to make the process of learning an adventure, as well as a life enriching experience.

National Education Policy (NEP) 2020

Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes under NEP 2020

Himachal Pradesh University has approved the adoption of the UGC Guidelines on Curriculum and Credit Framework under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, as per notification no. 7-1/2024-HPU(Acad) dated 02 April 2024. This Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes has been developed to introduce comprehensive reforms in higher education, in alignment with the objectives of NEP 2020. Government Degree College Haripurdhar, being an affiliated college of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, will implement this framework starting from the academic session 2026-27.

The framework is designed to offer students flexibility, opportunities for multidisciplinary learning, skill enhancement, research exposure, understanding of the Indian Knowledge System, and multiple entry/exit options. This allows learners to chart their educational journey according to their interests, abilities, and career aspirations.

The Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes by HPU has been formulated with the following NEP 2020 objectives in mind:

- To facilitate the all-round development of students, nurturing them as global citizens with a broad worldview.
- To provide learners with the freedom to select their educational paths and programmes, enabling them to align their studies with their talents and interests.
- To break down rigid hierarchies between disciplines and eliminate barriers between different fields of study, fostering holistic and multidisciplinary education that integrates knowledge seamlessly.
- To encourage creativity, critical thinking, logical decision-making, and innovation among students.
- To instill ethical and constitutional values.
- To promote multilingualism and highlight the importance of language in teaching and learning.
- To develop essential life skills, including communication, cooperation, teamwork, and resilience.
- To integrate research as an essential component of high-quality education and overall development.
- To incorporate relevant aspects of the Indian Knowledge System into various disciplines.
- To emphasize skill development, community engagement, and practical application of knowledge in real-life contexts.

NEP 2020- SEMESTER AND CREDIT STRUCTURE

An academic year/session is divided into two semesters; each semester is of six months duration. In a Semester, a student will study DSC, DSE, MC, MDC, SEC, AEC, VAC & do I/A/P/C as well as dissertation/academic project in four-year programme. The four year programme shall be offered initially in select colleges of the state as per the directions of the higher authorities.

During the vacation period, students are motivated for internships, apprenticeships, community outreach etc. This is particularly beneficial for students who plan to exit after two or four semesters of study.

Major Course/ DSC/Core: This is the main subject a student wishes to study during their undergraduate course. It is the area of study that the student is most passionate about and may wish to pursue as a career. Students may be permitted to change their major within the broad discipline at the end of the second semester, providing them with ample time to explore interdisciplinary courses during their first year.

Minor Course: This is a secondary area of study that complements the student's chosen Major. Students who complete a sufficient number of courses in a discipline or an interdisciplinary area of study other than their chosen Major will qualify for a Minor e.g. 32 credits in case of four-year UG programme in a single Minor discipline. A student may declare their choice of Minor and vocational stream at the end of the second semester.

Multidisciplinary Course: All undergraduate students are required to complete three introductory-level courses relating to any of the broad disciplines. These courses aim to broaden the student's intellectual experience and form part of liberal arts and science education. Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already taken as their proposed Major and Minor stream under this category. MDC must be selected from broad discipline/ pool of MDCs other than Major and Minor subjects.

Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): The courses aim to enable students to acquire and demonstrate core linguistic skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills. Students will choose from Ability enhancement Courses-English or Hindi. AECs should be in a language other than what is studied in DSCs/Minors.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses aim to impart practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc., to enhance the employability of students. SEC Courses will be of 3-credits each and will be taught upto 3rd semester. Two SECs (SEC-1 & SEC-2) must be chosen from Discipline Specific Course (Core & Minor).

Value Added Course (VAC): These courses are designed to provide extra skills or knowledge beyond the standard curriculum, often tailored towards enhancing employability, promoting entrepreneurship, or developing personal and professional skills.

Multiple Exits and Entries:

As permissible under UGC Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Higher Education Institutions, students will be allowed to enter/re-enter in the odd semesters and exit after even semesters, provided that they fulfil the minimum requirements for entry and exit.

Besides, the following should apply:

- a. A student will receive a certificate/diploma/degree upon exiting the HPU-UGP (depending on the year of graduation), provided they have passed all the minimum compulsory courses at that point in time.
- b. After exiting, either at the end of Year 1 or Year 2, the student can seek entry only into the same program to which they were initially admitted.
- c. When a student exits the HPU-UGP after 3 years with a Bachelor's Degree, she/he cannot seek reentry into the programme in the fourth year; instead/they will need to take admission into the Master's programme in the first year.

- d. Students with a UG degree with Honours and Research after 4 years can directly progress to a PhD programme, provided they secure a minimum of 75% marks.
- f. As the contents (syllabi) of all courses are subject to modification from time to time, when a student re-enters the programme after an earlier exit, they must study the content of all courses available at that time.

NEP 2020- SIGNFICANT NOTES
(AS NOTIFIED BY HIMACHAL PRADESH UNIVERISITY)

1. The prescribed credit weightage includes Lecture, Tutorial, and Practical components.
2. In the first semester, students will be offered three different subjects within the same stream: A, B, and C (Core and Minor are provided here for illustrative purposes only).
3. At the end of the second semester, each student may choose one of two programmes: the Multi-Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary or Single Core Discipline (Major) programme. The student choosing the latter will be required to give his/her Major and Minor at the end of the second semester. Such choices, including DSCs made at the end of the second semester, shall remain in effect until the VI semester.
4. Additional Seats: The Colleges may create 10% extra seats over and above the sanctioned strength to accommodate the request for a change of major. Any unfilled or vacant seats may be filled with those seeking a change of Major. Preference will be given to those with the highest CGPA and no arrears in the first year/semester.
5. The DSCs of another discipline for the first two semesters of students who opt for Major programmes will be treated as Minors.
6. A DSC offered in one discipline will be treated as a Minor by another. Students can choose Minor Courses from two different subjects, but must earn a minimum of 12 credits in each.
7. MDCs must be selected from a broad discipline/pool of MDCs other than Major and Minor subjects.
8. AEC/VAC/SEC-3 should be chosen from a pool of courses. Every discipline shall provide these courses, some of which will be offered discipline-specific, while the rest can be open to students of all other disciplines. However, the two SECs (SEC-1 & SEC-2) must be chosen from the discipline-specific (Core and Minor).
9. A maximum of two language courses can be opted for as Core and Minor. ABCs should be in a language other than what is studied in DSCs/Minors.
10. I/A/P/C will be determined at the end of the first semester to enable students to carry out some I/A/P/C activities during winter vacation.
11. To pursue an Honours & Honours with research in the 4th year, students will have to successfully complete 3-year UG Degree and choose only one discipline in both semesters, in which s/he have studied 6 DSCs and 5 DSEs in the first three years.
12. A student who secures 75% or more marks in aggregate till semester 6 (up to a 3-year degree) shall be eligible for a 4-year degree Honours with Research, provided HPU has approved the college to offer it.
13. One course per semester (DSC/Minor/MDC/SEC/etc.) from a subject offered in two (or more) different programs (e.g. BCA and BSc / BPA and BA / BFA and BA / Shastri and BA / etc.) must be the same.
14. Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfillment of the following conditions: For Major: 60 credits in a 3-year & 80 credits in a 4-year UG programme in a single Major Discipline. For Minor: 32 credits in a 4-year UG programme in a single Minor Discipline.
15. The Dissertation and Project will start in the VII semester. However, the evaluation and assessment will be conducted in both the VII and VIII semesters. *As this scheme is being introduced for the first time, it is subject to modifications.

Any changes applied in subsequent years after admission to the 1st semester will be retrospectively applicable.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION IN UG COURSES

Eligibility for admission to various Undergraduate programmes for the academic session 2026-27 shall be made as per the rules and regulation laid down by Himachal Pradesh University ordinances and criteria adopted by the University under NEP 2020.

General Eligibility Criteria- Candidates must have passed 10+2 (Senior Secondary) Examination or its equivalent from a Board recognised by Himachal Pradesh University. Candidates must have passed in four subjects including English (compulsory for B.A. and B.Com. streams).

AGE LIMIT FOR ADMISSION IN UG COURSES

For admission to the 1st Semester, a student must not be more than 23 Years (25 Years for girls) of age on 1st July 2026, e.g. the applicant should not be born earlier than 01/07/2003 in case of boys and 01/07/2001 in case of girls. However, in respect of SC and ST students, a relaxation of 3 years is given.

The Vice-Chancellor of H.P.U.-Shimla has the power to permit age relaxation up to a maximum of 6 months. All such cases could provisionally be granted age relaxation up to six months by the Principal and a consolidated list of such cases be sent for approval of the Vice-Chancellor. A candidate who has availed age relaxation at the time of first admission shall be eligible for the same in the subsequent classes also.

RAGGING: A PUNISHABLE OFFENCE

Ragging is a punishable offence. Ragging of all kind is strictly banned in the college campus. Anybody caught indulging in this evil exercise shall face penalty under the law. Act remotely suggestive of ragging should be reported to the college authorities/to the member of anti-ragging committee. A student who commits the offence of ragging shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term, which may extend to three years or shall also be liable to a fine, which may extend to Rs. 50,000 or both.

In order to have zero tolerance and its total elimination from the educational institutions Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its orders dated 4th May, 2001; 16th May, 2007 and 11th Feb. 2009 has directed as under:

“Ragging is banned in the institution. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be exemplary and justifiably harsh.” Punishment for ragging includes:

- Imprisonment, fine or both.
- Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology.
- Withholding scholarship or other benefits.
- Debarring from representation in events.
- Withholding of results.

CONTINUOUS AND COMPREHENSIVE EVALUATION (CCE)

The final grade that a student gets in a course, consists of following three Major components:

1. Class Attendance: Students are expected to be regular in attending the classes as this is very foundation of academic activities. In order to be eligible to appear in the University Examinations, a student must have 75% attendance in each of the course concerned, in theory as well as in practical separately. The incentive for the classroom attendance will be awarded as CCE marks as follows:

SR. NO.	ATTENDANCE %	MARKS
1.	75% to less than 80%	1
2.	80% to less than 85%	2
3.	85% to less than 90%	3
4.	90% to less than 95%	4
5.	95% and more	5

(NOTE: 75% of attendance in a course is mandatory as per H.P. University regulations.)

2. Mid-Term (Minor) Test: There will be one mid-term test, to be conducted when approximately 1/2 of the syllabus has been covered. Mid- term test will be conducted by the college in consultation with the teacher.

3. Assignment/Tutorials: CCE will be awarded on the basis of Assignment/Tutorials etc. that the course teacher will give to the students
(CCE for various courses in a semester is subject to the NEP 2020 guidelines adopted by Himachal Pradesh University.)

ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDITS (ABC)

WHAT IS ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDITS (ABC)?

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) is a virtual/digital storehouse that contains the information of the credits earned by individual students throughout their learning journey. It will enable students to open their accounts and give multiple options for entering and leaving colleges or universities. There will be “multiple exits” & “multiple entries” points during the higher education tenure & credits will be transferred through the ABC seamlessly.

ABC can be considered as an authentic reference to check the credit record of any student at any given point in time. Thus, the concept of ABC is fuel to boost the efficiency of faculty and help students embrace a multi-disciplinary educational approach. The idea is to make students “skillful professionals” and help their overall growth.

In a crux, the Academic Bank of Credits will be a game-changer in transforming Indian education to a great extent.

FUNCTIONS OF ABC

- The Academic Bank will be accountable for opening, closing, and validating the academic accounts of students.
- It will carry out tasks such as credit accumulation, credit verification, credit transfer/redemption of students.
- The courses include online and distance mode courses offered by the government and institutes.
- The validity of these academic credits earned by students will be up to seven years and students can redeem these credits.
- The credits can be redeemed and students can seek admission directly in the second year at any university.
- The validity will be up to seven years, hence, students will have to rejoin within seven years.

CREDIT INFORMATION AS PER ABC

As per the courses, a credit structure will be created by the Government. When a student pursues any course and clears exams, credits will be automatically awarded to them. Institutions need to fill out the details and upload the deposits in the students' Academic Credit Bank's account on the digital portal.

EVALUATION AND VERIFICATION OF CREDITS

Any kind of credit evaluation & verification will be carried out by the Academic Credit Bank at regular intervals. If students want to transfer the credits, they need to approach the ABC for further process. It will help in regulating the processes with ultimate authenticity.

TYPES OF COURSS

Online & offline– both types of courses are included in the scheme. Some of the important ones include National Schemes such as–

- NPTEL
- SWAYAM
- V-LAB

Thus, the ABC will cover almost all types of courses including distance learning courses to help students of every possible stream.

CREDITS VALIDITY

The credits earned by students will be valid for seven years. However, the validity of credits is subject to change depending on the type of courses or disciplines. In such instances, ABC will provide the details of the exceptions to students. Even if a student takes a break or is not able to continue their education, they may redeem the earned credits in the future within the time limit of seven years.

In accordance with NEP-2020, it is mandatory for all the students to generate their unique Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) ID before the next academic session. This can be done easily by following the steps given below:

1. Create account on Digilocker though Digilocker website.
2. Using your Aadhaar number and mobile no. linked with Aadhaar (In case the mobile number linked with Aadhaar is not active, then please update your mobile number by visiting Aadhaar update center viz. Post Office or authorized banks/CSC).
3. Then visit <https://www.abc.gov.in/>
Click on My Account > Student
4. Sign in using Digilocker account Id (linked mobile number)and password/pin
5. Select University>Himachal Pradesh University
6. Your ABC ID will be displayed on screen. Note it down and keep it safe.

REMEMBER: ABC ID is unique and can be generated only once.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) FOR ONGOING UNDERGRADUATE CLASSES

The Himachal Pradesh University vide Letter No. 2-1/2012 H.P.U. (Academic) dated 4 June 2016 has notified the acceptance of the course curriculum under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) brought out by the University Grant Commission.

Outlines of Choice Based Credit System:

1. **Core Course:** 12 for general courses; 4 discipline specific papers each for regular courses and 2 papers each for English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com.

2. **Elective Course:** Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

2.1 **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE):** (2 each for regular courses): An elective course offered under the main discipline/ subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

2.2 **Generic Elective (GE) Course:** (2 each for B.A. / B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline of choice is called a Generic Elective.

3. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). AECC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement: i. Environmental Science and ii. English/ Hindi/ MIL Communication/ Sanskrit. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

3.1 **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/ Hindi Communication/ MIL Communication/ Sanskrit.

3.2 **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** (4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.

IDENTITY CARD

Identity card is an important document as it shows the identity of a bonafide student. Soon after the admission in the college, Identity cum library card should be collected from the college library as per schedule prescribed by the Librarian. Each student must carry this card daily to the college. In case of loss of the identity card, duplicate identity card will be issued after producing the FIR in this context. For duplicate identity card, Rs. 30 /- will be charged. Students are not permitted to replace his/her photograph pasted on the identity card for any reason whatsoever. Students must carry their ID-Card along with them to college daily, anyone found without it will be fined.

LEAVE RULES

1. It is compulsory for all students get their leave sanctioned, before proceeding on leave. No student is supposed to be absent without getting his/her leave sanctioned by a course teacher or by the Principal.
2. Leave up to 03 days shall be sanctioned by the concerned subject teacher.
3. Leave more than 03 days shall be sanctioned by the Principal.
4. A student will be marked on-leave during the leave period and the same will not be considered for calculating the lecture attendance for determining eligibility to appear in the University exam.
5. Students who are officially deputed to participate in sports and extra-curricular activities of the H.P. University Youth Festival/Championships are treated on leave for the purpose of attendance, provided that prior permission has been sort from the Principal in this matter and its note has been made by the subject teacher in the attendance register.
6. Maximum leave during the academic session will not exceed more than 10 days. It is personal responsibility of each student to get his/her name entered in the attendance register of each concerned subject teacher. If he/she fails to do so, he/she will be treated absent.

NAMES TRUCK OFF AND RE-ADMISSION

1. If a student willingly remains absent continuously for 06 days without sanction of leave/ without information, and his/her 10 days absentee in a month, his/her name will be struck off from the College Rolls. He/she will have to seek re-admission on the recommendation of the concerned subject teacher.
2. Re-admission will be allowed within the next 06 days by paying the re-admission fee and absence fine as per rules, subject to the prior approval by the Principal.
3. Re-admission fee for the first time is Rs.100 and for the second time Rs.200.
4. There will be no re-admission for the third time.

MIGRATION

Migration from other colleges to this college and vice-versa is governed by H. P. University Rules. A migration certificate can be issued only if the student is registered with the H.P. University.

LIBRARY

Library is the storehouse of knowledge, when explored viciously by the hungry minds to satiate their never ending quest for knowledge. The college library in the new campus has sufficient space and abundant quality furniture for the seekers of knowledge. The library presently has books on various subjects and disciplines.

LIBRARY RULES:-

Students are expected to make the maximum use of library facility during their free periods and follow the rules mentioned below:

- (i) Only two books shall be issued at a time for a period of 14 days. If the issued book(s) is not Returned or re-issued in time a fine will be charged per book, per day.
- (ii) Reference books will not be issued.
- (iii) In case of a loss or damage of an issued book, it will either be replaced or its payment at the present cost will be accepted only with the permission of the Principal.

COMPUTER LAB

To keep pace with the fast changing field of Information & Communication Technology, an IT Lab has been set up at the college to benefit the college students. It is well-equipped with computers, an Over Head Projector and PA system. The computer lab has recently been upgraded through the utilization of RUSA funds for purchase of a Server with Tally ERP-9 software and 15 additional computers along with necessary furniture, networking and installation of 5 KVA UPS. A free Wi-Fi facilities has also been installed in the college campus and is functional since December 2017.

SPORTS & CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

“A Healthy Mind Resides in a Healthy Body”. Co-curricular activities are the components of non-academic curriculum that helps in developing various aspects of the personality of the students. They supplement and compliment the main curriculum to bring about an all-round development of the students. They are the practical experiences of students. Theoretical knowledge gets strengthened when a relevant co-curricular activity is organized. The college organizes various events such as: sports/games, Debate, Declamation, Discussion, folk songs, folk dance, fancy dress competition, Quiz Contests etc. from time to time. The Sports Committee conducts frequent trials to select teams for participation in inter-college sports competitions as and when organized by the University. Students are encouraged to participate in these activities to help them develop frankness, clarity and fluency of language, coordination, adjustment and better self-expression.

COLLEGE STUDENTS' CENTRAL ASSOCIATION (CSCA)

Students of today are the leaders of tomorrow. To encourage students participation in maintaining proper academic atmosphere and in organizing cultural activities etc., and to promote opportunities for the development of character, leadership and discipline and the spirit of service among students, the Students' Central Association is constituted every year. The posts of office bearers and class representatives are filled as per the rules/schedule announced by H.P. University every year. Other members of CSCA are nominated by the Principal in accordance with the CSCA constitution.

PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

PTA has been established under section 2.33 to 2.33.7 of the HP Education Code, 2001, in the college to facilitate community-college participation. It helps in better coordination and interaction between parents and teachers for improvement of academic standards and infrastructural facilities. It provides an interface for exchanging ideas, promote mutual understanding and increase the effectiveness of the educational programs by improving the environment. Parents, guardians (blood relation of the students), teachers and head of the institution are members of this association. - Any student using Alcohol, Tobacco, Gutkha and other narcotics in the college campus will be fined upto Rs.500/-and is liable for expulsion or resuscitation from the college.
- Only those functions will be allowed to be held in the college which are organized by college or have been permitted by the college authorities with prior permission from the concerned authorities. Failing which, would be treated as a case of breach of discipline.
- No tours/parties will be organized without proper authorization from the principal.
- Unnecessary use of mobile phones or playing music on mobile phones in the campus.

7. A student who is found guilty of misconduct shall not be eligible for any scholarship, prize, fee concession or membership of the CSCA or any other important bodies in the college.
